We have higher than national average proportions of students who are 21 and over, from areas with low participation in higher education, with disclosed disabilities and experiencing multiple causes of disadvantage.

We have identified the most significant indications of challenge to our prospective and current students through our assessment of performance. Our primary data sources are the OfS access and participation dashboard, UCAS data and our staff and student consultation feedback.
